STATUS OF WOMEN & COUNTRY INITIATIVES

A Seminar was organized by the WGU on the "Status of Women & Country Initiatives".

The three keynote speakers invited were the Consul-General of Sri Lanka, Ms. Saroja Sirisena, Deputy High Commissioner and Consul-General of Bangladesh, Ms. Samina Naz, and the Consul - General of South Africa, Ms. M L Ramokgopa.

All three women spoke eloquently on the important role played by women in their country. Women were emancipated, career-oriented and confident in every field and even outnumbered their male counterparts in Parliament. They stressed the importance of creating awareness and on education to empower women, as they "manned", as it were, the highest echelons of power and influence in their country. Health and education of women and children were paramount considerations to be emphasized in the future planning of government policies and plans. This policy had led to their all-encompassing growth, giving them a sense of fulfilment and pride.

The lively interaction that followed between the three guest speakers and the largely female audience was very enlightening. It certainly revealed their interests and concerns for their counterparts in Sri Lanka, South Africa and Bangladesh. The poise and sound knowledge of the three Consul-Generals assured the audience of a safe and progressive future for the women of Sri Lanka, South Africa and Bangladesh.

Ms. Saroja Sirisena revealed that all the children in Sri Lanka were entitled to the same level of education whether rich or poor, irrespective of their community or background. The children in government schools benefited equally as their counterparts from private schools.

It was an enjoyable evening full of camaraderie and fellowship as the participants enjoyed a delicious dinner served by our in-house Acme Caterers.

POPE OPENS FREE LAUNDRETTE FOR HOMELESS

Pope Francis has opened a free launderette in Rome in the latest of a series of initiatives for poor people that has included help with housing, showers, haircuts, meals and medical care. Six washing machines and dryers were donated to the facility in the city centre. Detergent, fabric softener and a number of irons have also been provided, reported the Guardian. The Lavanderia di Papa Francesco (Pope Francis Laundry) is intended to “restore dignity to many people who are our brothers and sisters”, the Vatican said. The launderette is located in a former hospital near the Vatican. Showers, a barbershop and medical facilities will also be added, reported the daily. Two years ago, the Pope opened a shower and barber service next to St. Peter’s Basilica and a dormitory nearby.
